Using the 'we' form of -ER verbs

Remember, some Spanish infinitives end in -er. The verb ending changes depending on who the verb refers to. To mean 'I' with an –er verb, remove –er and add <u>–</u> $Escondo = ____ hide ___ Vendo = ____ sell ___.$ To mean 'we' with an -er verb, remove -er and add -emos. esconder escond

- - escondemos (we hide)



Using the 'they' form of -ER verbs

To say 'they' do an action in the present tense, remove the -ER from the infinitive and add **-en**.
