Present tense

-er, -ir verbs: 1st person singular & plural (I / we)

This part of the verb is called the 'stem'.

beb**er**



bebo



beb**emos**

escrib**ir**



escribo



escrib**imos**

To mean I with an -er or -ir verb, remove **-er** or **-ir** and add **-o** to the stem.

To mean we with an -er verb, remove **-er** and add **-emos** to the stem.

To mean we with an -ir verb, remove **-ir** and add **-imos** to the stem.



Present tense

-er, -ir verbs: 3rd person singular & plural (s/he, it / they)

s/he, it

Lee**e** revistas.

S/he reads magazines.

Vive**e** en una ciudad.

S/he lives in a city.

they

-en

Lee**en** revistas.

They read magazines.

Vive**en** en una ciudad.

They live in a city.

Present tense

-er, -ir verbs: 3rd person singular & plural (s/he, it / they)



To mean 's/he' or 'it' with an -er or -ir verb, remove **-er** or **-ir** and add **-e** to the stem.

To mean 'they' with an -er or -ir verb, remove **-er** or **-ir** and add **-en** to the stem.



Present tense: -er, -ir verbs

1. The verb ending for the 1st person singular ('I') for -er and -ir verbs is -O.
2. -er and -ir verbs have a different endings for the 1st person plural (we). true / false
3. -e is the ending for 3rd person singular (-er / =ir verbs).
4. To mean 'they' with -er & -ir verbs, we need to remove -er and -ir and add -en to the stem.
5. 'Cuando hace mal tiempo' translates as when it's bad weather



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
