The demonstrative "dies" and adjective endings



# **Demonstrative adjectives (eg "dies" - this) follow the same pattern as the definite article**

	<b>Masculine</b>	<b>Feminine</b>	<b>Neuter</b>	<b>Plural</b>
<b>Nominative</b>	dieser	diese	dieses	diese
<b>Accusative</b>	diesen	diese	dieses	diese
<b>Genitive</b>	dieses	dieser	dieses	dieser
<b>Dative</b>	diesem	dieser	diesem	diesen




# **Nominative and accusative adjective endings after demonstratives**

	<b>Masculine</b>	<b>Feminine</b>	<b>Neuter</b>	<b>Plural</b>
<b>Nominative</b>	dieser rote Kuli	diese gelbe Tasse	dieses weiße Tischtuch	diese leckeren Bonbons
<b>Accusative</b>	diesen roten Kuli	diese gelb e Tasse	dieses weiße Tischtuch	diese leckeren Bonbons



# Can you change the definite article to the demonstrative?

Nominative with definite article	Nominative with demonstrative
<b>der bunte Schal</b>	<b>dieser bunte Schal</b>
<b>die schwarze Hose</b>	<b>diese schwarze Hose</b>
<b>das modische Sweatshirt</b>	<b>dieses modische Sweatshirt</b>
<b>die schönen Kleider</b>	<b>diese schönen Kleider</b>



# Can you change the definite article to the demonstrative?

Accusative with definite article	Accusative with demonstrative
<b>den bunten Schal</b>	<b>diesen bunten Schal</b>
<b>die schwarze Hose</b>	<b>diese schwarze Hose</b>
<b>das modische Sweatshirt</b>	<b>dieses modische Sweatshirt</b>
<b>die schönen Kleider</b>	<b>diese schönen Kleider</b>



# Summary of learning

In German, demonstrative adjectives follow the same pattern as the definite article

	Masculine	Feminine	Neuter	Plural
Nominative	dies <b>er</b>	dies <b>e</b>	dies <b>es</b>	dies <b>e</b>
Accusative	dies <b>en</b>	dies <b>e</b>	dies <b>es</b>	dies <b>en</b>

The accusative pattern is as follows:

Accusative	dies <b>en</b>	dies <b>e</b>	dies <b>es</b>	dies <b>en</b>
------------	----------------	---------------	----------------	----------------

Any adjectives after demonstratives have the same endings as after the definite article (see previous lesson)
