

### How do you know what a shop sells?

Ask a parent or carer to help you research online

- Ask a parent or carer to take you to look inside the entrance of the shop or through the shop window
- Ask a parent or carer to help you look for adverts on TV or in the newspaper



#### Research online: Task

Ask a parent or Carer to help you answer the following:

- 1. Where can I buy some new garden furniture?
- 2. Where can I buy a hairdryer?
- 3. Where can I buy a birthday cake?



# Look inside the entrance of the shop or through the shop window

#### Task:

- Next time you pass a shop, ask a parent or carer to help you take a photo of the items they are advertising
- When you get home, write a list of the items you have seen and find another shop that sells the same items (asking your parent or carer for help using the internet if needed)



# Look for adverts on TV or in the newspaper

#### Task:

- 1. With a parent or carer's permission, turn the television on and ask your parent or carer to help you find an appropriate channel. When an advert comes on, write down what item is being advertised and think about or ask a parent or carer to help you research which shop you could buy it from.
- 2. Ask your parent or carer to help find a newspaper or magazine to look at and make a list of ten items you can buy in a shop. Make a note of what shop you could buy them in.



# Create a fantasy shopping list Have a think about what shops you will need to buy your items



#### **Example:**

What I need:	Where from?
Orange juice	Tesco
New jumper	Primark
New trainers	Sports Direct
Shampoo	Superdrug
Biscuits	Tesco
Kitchen spray	Wilko



### **Independent Living: Community Living**

Knowing which shop to buy from.

#### Make it easier

Focus on one genre of shop at a time. E.g. list all the different clothes shops you are familiar with and talk about the different items available.

Create a realistic shopping list with a family member or carer and shop for the items on your list.

#### Make it harder

Find out whether the shops you are familiar with do online shopping - ask your parent or carer to help you go online and browse the items available.

Use past experiences for examples: What shop have you been to recently and what did you buy?

#### More ideas

Ask your parent or carer to help you have a look online at the different shops on your local high street.

Discuss what your favourite shop is and what you would like to buy if you could visit there.
